As the solo violinist of the 20th Century Consort, Ms. Adkins is a noted interpreter of the contemporary repertoire.

She performs in concert with her husband, pianist Edward Newman; the duo has presented concerts at the Kennedy Center and the National Gallery, and was featured as the inaugural program of public radio's *Front Row Washington*. The Adkins/Newman Duo make their area debut in October 2015 at TCU.
